

**AMENDMENT NO. 6**  
**ST. LOUIS GRAPHIC ARTS JOINT HEALTH & WELFARE FUND**  
**PLAN AND SUMMARY PLAN DESCRIPTION OF JANUARY 1, 2016**

Deductible and Prescription Drug Co-pay Changes

WHEREAS, the St. Louis Graphic Arts Joint Health & Welfare Fund is not a grandfathered plan under the Affordable Care Act; and

WHEREAS, Specialty Drugs are very expensive and are a large part of the costs paid by the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Plan can have some control over the costs from Specialty Drugs by using a dedicated Specialty Pharmacy;

Pursuant to the Trustees' authority under Section 3.02 and Section 6.01 of the St. Louis Graphic Arts Joint Health & Welfare Fund Trust Agreement of August 1, 1979, the January 1, 2016 Summary Plan Description is hereby amended effective January 1, 2017 to limit coverage of certain specialty medications to prescriptions obtained through the Express Scripts Specialty Pharmacy, Accredo.

Amendment

**Effective January 1, 2017, the Fund will limit coverage of certain specialty medications to prescriptions obtained through Accredo, Express Scripts Specialty Pharmacy.**

Section 5.6 "Specialty Drugs Prescribed by a Physician for Home Use" is amended as follows:

Certain specialty drugs are prescribed by a Physician for home use. Most specialty medications will be covered when obtained from the Fund's Preferred Specialty pharmacy which is the Express Scripts Specialty Pharmacy, Accredo ~~or from any of the PBM's network pharmacies. Effective January 1, 2017, the Fund will not cover specialty medications filled by other pharmacies. In certain cases, however, the Fund, through its PBM, has negotiated preferred pricing for using a single pharmacy for a specific specialty medication. Before using a pharmacy other than the Fund's Preferred Specialty pharmacy you should check to make sure the medication will be covered.~~ These drugs will not be covered if obtained from a non-network pharmacy or other home delivery service. The Fund's formulary applies to specialty medications.

Specialty drugs are drugs that are used in treating serious illnesses and conditions such as cancer, hemophilia, hepatitis C, multiple sclerosis and rheumatoid arthritis and are sometimes administered by injection or infusion. If your doctor prescribes a specialty drug for you, please contact the customer service number on the back of your prescription drug card for assistance ~~in determining what pharmacies are available to fill your specialty medication.~~

See Section 4.3.4.M, for information concerning coverage of specialty drugs dispensed or administered by a Physician or Hospital.

4.3.4 “Covered Charges with Special Limitations” is amended as follows:

M. Specialty Drugs Dispensed or Administered by a Physician or Hospital - Charges payable for certain specialty drugs dispensed or administered by a Physician or Hospital must be obtained from the Fund’s Preferred Specialty pharmacy ~~or from another network pharmacy~~, unless preapproved by case management. Note, in ~~some~~ almost all cases, only the Fund’s Preferred Specialty Pharmacy, the Express Scripts Specialty Pharmacy, Accredo, may be used.

Specialty drugs are drugs that are used in treating serious illnesses and conditions such as cancer, hemophilia, Hepatitis C and rheumatoid arthritis and are sometimes administered by injection or infusion. If your doctor or Hospital proposes to directly administer or dispense any drug to you, for example by an injection or infusion in the office or Hospital, please contact the customer service number on the back of your prescription drug card and a customer service representative can tell you whether the drug is a specialty drug and if it is, case management will direct you to a pharmacy where you can obtain the drug at a lower cost to you and to the Plan.

Additional information regarding the medications to which this provision currently applies is available from the customer service number on the back of your prescription drug card. The information, however, is subject to change at any time and you should check every time your doctor proposes a new specialty drug.

In all other respects the Plan of Benefits is not changed.
